Mr. Bradley's office will not review the surveys but rather will merely be receiving them - they will then be delivered in bulk to the Chairman of the GBA's Judicial Liaison Committee, Mr. Ignacio Aguigui, at the Law Office of Lujan, Aguigui & Perez, Suite 300, Pacific News Building, Hagatna which will undertake review and compilation of the results.

For confidentiality, you may seal your survey in an unmarked envelope, place that envelope in a second envelope, seal that second envelope, clearly identify yourself on that second outside envelope with your printed name and legible signature and deliver it to Mr. Bradley's office. You may fax your response to him at 475-3400 if confidentiality is not a concern. However you must print and sign your name legibly on the survey or attached cover sheet. Please note that your submission must be legibly signed for your survey to be counted.
