15 Because of the public health concerns arising from the COVID-19 (coronavirus)  
16 pandemic, the State of Emergency declared by *I Maga'håga Guåhan* in Executive Order No.  
17 2020-03 on March 14, 2020, the closure by *I Maga'håga* in Executive Order No. 2020-04 of  
18 non-essential government operations for fourteen (14) days beginning March 16, 2020, the order  
19 of *I Maga'håga* for social isolation, and the announcement by *I Maga'håga* on March 23, 2020,  
20 that because of the increasing community spread of the virus and lack of hospital beds, she is  
21 extending the closure order for at least two more weeks, the court, under its jurisdiction to issue  
22 orders in aid of its supervisory jurisdiction over the Superior Court of Guam and all other courts  
23 of the judicial branch of Guam, **ORDERS:**

- 24 1. Any temporary restraining order, injunction, civil protection order, or stay set to  
25 expire on or after March 23, 2020, in any criminal or civil matter, shall  
26 automatically be extended under the same terms for fourteen (14) days or up to  
27 April 15, 2020, whichever is longer; unless the Presiding Judge, or a judge who  
28 issued the order, terminates or modifies the temporary restraining order,  
injunction, civil protection order, or stay.
