

ERK OF COURT 4 IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF GUAM 5 6 IN RE: GENERAL ORDER NO. 20-000 8 7 COURT OPERATIONS IN RESPONSE 8 TO COVID-19 ORDER CONCERNING JURY TRIALS AND OTHER PROCEEDINGS 9 10 11 WHEREAS, in response to the spread of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), the 12 President has declared a national public health emergency and the Governor of Guam has declared 13 a public health emergency for Guam; and 14 WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and other public health 15 authorities have advised the taking of precautions to reduce the possibility of exposure to the virus 16 and slow the spread of the disease; 17 NOW, THEREFORE, in order to protect public health, and in order to reduce the size of 18 public gatherings and reduce unnecessary travel, the District of Guam hereby issues the following 19 order: 20 The District Court of Guam will remain open for business, subject to the following 1. 21 limitations. 22 2. Effective immediately, all jury selection and trials in the District of Guam 23 scheduled to begin before April 26, 2020, are continued pending further order of the Court. The 24

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Court may issue other orders concerning future continuances as necessary and appropriate.

- 3. Individual judges may continue trial-specific deadlines in criminal and civil cases in the exercise of their discretion.
- 4. Individual judges presiding over criminal proceedings may take such actions consistent with this order as may be lawful and appropriate to ensure the fairness of the proceedings and preserve the rights of the parties.
- 5. The Court is cognizant of the right of criminal defendants to a speedy and public trial under the Sixth Amendment, and the application of that right in cases involving defendants who are detained pending trial. Any motion by a criminal defendant seeking an exception to this order in order to exercise that right should be directed to the judge assigned to the matter in the first instance; provided, however, that no such exception may be ordered without the approval of the Chief Judge.
- 6. The time period of any continuance entered as a result of this order shall be excluded under the Speedy Trial Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(A), as the Court finds that the ends of justice served by taking that action outweigh the interests of the parties and the public in a speedy trial. Absent further order of the Court or any individual judge, the period of exclusion shall be from March 16, 2020 to April 26, 2020. The Court may extend the period of exclusion as circumstances may warrant.
- 7. Individual judges may continue to hold hearings, conferences, and bench trials in the exercise of their discretion, consistent with this order.
- 8. Judges are strongly encouraged to conduct court proceedings by telephone or video conferencing where practicable.
- 9. Criminal matters before the Magistrate Judge, such as initial appearances, arraignments, detention hearings, and the issuance of search warrants, shall continue to take place in the ordinary course.

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- 10. All regularly scheduled grand jury proceedings are continued to April 26, 2020, however, the U.S. Attorney may schedule grand jury proceedings for emergency or essential matters. Grand jurors will continue their current and normal practice to call in each Monday at 8 a.m. to the number provided to them to receive the recorded message informing them of whether they must appear for grand jury service the same week.
- 11. All naturalization ceremonies scheduled for March and April 2020 are canceled. The Court may issue other orders concerning future continuances as necessary and appropriate.
- 12. Drug Offender Re-Entry program scheduled for March 18, 2020 will be rescheduled.
- 13. All non-court related events (court tours, community outreach events) for March and April 2020 are canceled.
- 14. The Clerk's Office and U.S. Probation Office, and all other Court services shall remain open pending further order of the Court.
